Australian Air Cadets Alumni is Airborne

Former air cadets and staff now have the opportunity to re-establish lost friendships and share memories from their past thanks to the launch of the Air Cadets Alumni.

Following an overwhelming response from former members of the Air Training Corps which was first formed in 1941 and its successor organisations, the AirTC and Australian Air Force Cadets (AAFC), the AAFC National Council decided to support the establishment of an alumni association. Over 700 former cadets and staff have so far joined the Australian Air Cadets Alumni. They include the current and former Air Force Chiefs and a handful of former cadets from the early 1940s. Most former members have very fond memories of their air cadet experience, and over time, the Alumni will create opportunities for its members to contribute to the development of today's air cadets.
